Thursday began with a crippled beggar from a stroke a year ago with a paralysed arm hand and leg. He had lost his job and spent all his money on doctors and ended up a beggar. The Lord instantly healed him and as he opened his paralysed hand and arm, he stood up tall and walked, everyone praised God in amazement. He testified and built up the peoples faith so much that every single sick person was healed and many became Christians.

In the evening it rained hard so Pastor Simon rebuked the rain and the rain stopped and the evening went well, ending a very successful conference. All I had to do was teach the cross, preach the power and watch Jesus heal the sick.

REPORT ON INDIA

With just six days to make the arrangements, I volunteered to accompany Suzanne on her trip to India. Since we had only met briefly, it was an act of faith on both our parts. It was a risk worth taking, as God blessed the five days we spent together in constant fellowship.

Suzanne preached simple, clear messages and signs and wonders followed. The deaf heard, the blind saw, the dumb spoke, the paralysed moved, and pain from every area of the body went! The most moving healing was a crippled beggar. His hand and arms were paralysed and legs very stiff. Suzanne immediately asked him if he'd like to be able to move again and was he willing to let Jesus heal him. I don't know who cried more - him, or me, as his hands, arms and legs became free and mobile. It was a biblical healing in real life. Of course having experienced the reality of Jesus he then accepted Jesus is the only God.

The conference was considerably smaller than expected but it was all filmed for TV. Please pray that the three programmes planned will be screened.

Over the three days about half of those who came to the meetings came forward to accept Jesus as Lord of their lives.

We stayed with Simon Peter, pastor of Jesus Prayer Ministries. His family made us very welcome and comfortable. We were presented with saris and wore them to the evening meeting on the last day. The women of the family had to dress us – we felt, and looked, like royalty! Suzanne was invited to unveil a plaque commemorating the founding of the Ministry's building.

It is a privilege to spend time with Suzanne, praying and taking daily communion. I admire her devoted obedience to the call our Father has placed on her life. Living in very basic conditions with the Pastors' families elsewhere in the world, together with unwanted wildlife, particularly at night, is a calling most of us would struggle with.
