IMF minister, Steve Goode is the international director of *Mercy Ministries of Youth With A Mission* (YWAM).

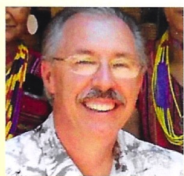
Steve and his wife Marie travel extensively to visit and support 20,000 staff members and 25,000 students who are reaching out to the 1 billion poorest in the world who are living in 200 countries.

Steve comments, "Where we work there are things that are not very pretty, not very conducive to praising God. Like boat people where all the women have been raped; like abandoned children wailing in their anguish; like people who rip you off; like people whose blank, staring eyes tell you they have nothing left to hope in. In the midst of all the heartache we are able to reveal the heart of God through worship, to show people that our great and loving God is present in the ugliness of a refugee camp to heal, restore and give hope to the hopeless."

Steve and Marie are pioneers with YWAM and have trained many young people over the last 30+ years. Steve functions as the Ambassador for YWAM Mercy. He is also a member of YWAM's Global Leadership Forum. He trained in college for media and journalism, and is a prolific writer and a speaker at conferences around the globe. Steve and Marie give voice for the poorest in the World.

Vaden & Joyce Williams

God has called Vaden and Joyce Williams to train and care for church leaders in Thailand, Laos, Burma, Sri Lanka and India. They

effectively combine resources with other missionaries to train hundreds of church planters, pastors, evangelists

and teachers. Through these collaborative efforts, thousands have come to Christ.

The Williamses have been instrumental in Thailand to develop the Thailand Pentecostal Seminary, the Nong Khai Training Center, and the Ban Mai Children's Homes. In addition, Vaden and Joyce facilitate four schools of ministry for underground/unregistered church leaders in Laos.

Vaden and Joyce also visit ministry leaders and their families in Laos who are persecuted. Some leaders are imprisoned and their families are left without a father. Through these visits, the hurting families are blessed spiritually, financially and emotionally. The Williamses even deliver sewing machines to these persecuted families so they can support themselves.

A great example of the fruit through the Williamses mission is the Telegu School of Ministry in India that was launched 5 years ago. This program has eleven Intensive Foundational Courses for Church Planting in India. In the first year 25 students graduated; there were 38 in the second; 43 in the third year; 93 in the fourth year and 54 this past year! Pastors who have graduated from the Telegu School of Ministry are leading over 250 churches.



Susanne Pillans

Suzanne Pillans is an evangelist who operates training centers for evangelists and oversees orphanages throughout

remote villages of Africa, India and Asia. Specifically, the training centers and orphanages are in areas where the people have not yet heard the gospel. She travels extensively, speaking in many countries at conferences and churches as an evangelist with a healing ministry.

Suzanne started the first Bible school for training native evangelists in Ghana in 2006. Now there are 346 bible schools in several countries that graduated 22,327 students in 2012, which totals 64,086 graduates so far in her ministry. These evangelists planted 4,562 churches in 2012 with a recorded 39,469 conversions.

Suzanne's wide ranging ministry includes her first orphanage with a Christian School in Bala, Kenya for 380 orphans, which achieved the highest standards in the Bala region with 20 students obtaining the top marks in their region.

Suzanne's ministry is unique in yet another manner. One-third of the support for her ministry comes from her own equestrian training center/retreat center called Standlake Ranch in the Cotswold Hills, 15 miles west of Oxford, England.

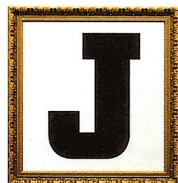
Diane Brask

Diane serves as an International Ambassador, actively involved in building many networks with indigenous leaders around the world to provide training and

assistance to their communities. These networks are in some of the most remote and neglected communities of the world; China, India, Kenya, the Philippines, Thailand, Mexico, Sudan and Uganda. Diane uses her gifts of evangelism, preaching and teaching as she speaks at many conferences, forums, seminars and Bible studies in the US and around the World.

Missionary Brask has a calling and passion for the rural, small-town, often forgotten or overlooked people around the world. This passion has led her to stand along side of missionaries to help them meet critical needs of the people they serve. She uses her influence to create a network of support for missionaries.

Among the many that have been blessed by Diane's ministry are 48 Chinese missionaries who work among 19 different people groups in 7 different provinces of China representing work among 12 ethnic minorities and 7 different Muslim people groups. As a result of the support that she has delivered from her fund raising efforts in the US, thousands have put their faith in Christ. All over China small house-church fellowships filled with new believers are growing in villages that just a few years ago had no Christians in them at all.



Missionary J

We use this byname for this missionary because she ministers in a sensitive region of the world and identifying her could place him in danger.

Violence is quite common in this part of the world, especially against those who trust in Jesus. J is a 6th grade teacher. At the school, all classes are in English, so that the children can become fluent in English. The school draws many students because parents know that children who know English have a better chance of a successful career.

J spends time in building deep relationships and as trust deepens, she shares Christ. As these nationals then respond and come to faith, J disciples them through Bible Study, prayer and using her life as an example. Those who come to faith are using their influence to share Jesus. Even if sometime he must leave, those who have come to faith through J's testimony will continue to share Christ.



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
