

Teaching Letter Revival and The kingdom of Heaven

What is revival? The Oxford Dictionary explains it as "Bringing or coming back into". We may ask Bringing into, or coming back to what? Psalm 145: 10-13 speaks of *the glory of God's Kingdom, to make known to the sons of man His mighty acts*. Then Isaiah 9: 6-7 prophesies the coming of the Christ, who would bring to earth His everlasting Kingdom as confirmed by the Angel Gabriel in Luke 1: 32-33.

Jesus then fulfils the prophesy in Matthew 4:16-17 and then went about all Galilee preaching the gospel of the Kingdom in Mathew

4: 23 He then told His disciples to do the same in Mathew 10: 1 and the 70 in Luke 17: 20-21.

This aroused the Pharisees to ask Jesus when the Kingdom of God would come and Jesus answered them in Luke 17: 20-21 and said *the Kingdom of God does not come with observation, nor will they say see here or see there, for indeed the Kingdom of God is within you*. He then shows us how to receive this through the Holy Spirit in John 3:5, and again in 1 Corinthians: 4: 20 which states *"For the Kingdom of God does not consist in talk but in power"*. Acts 1: 8 says *"but you shall receive power when the Holy Spirit has come upon you and you shall be witnesses to me in Jerusalem and in all Judea, Samaria and to the ends of the earth"*. Then in John 14: 12-13 He says *anyone who has faith in me will do what I have been doing. He will do even greater things than these because I am going to the Father.....*

Is this all talking about Revival? While preparing to speak to a 'Woman in a revival meeting' in New Zealand the Lord showed me something in a higher level. When Adam and Eve ate of the fruit from the Tree of the Knowledge of good and evil, the world passed over to Satan, in exchange for the knowledge of good and evil. Mankind was not just cut off from God, dying spiritually, to be born of the flesh only, but also to walk in the limits of the earthly realm and to be subject to sin, sickness and physical death. We had to live at a lower level where the impossible would always be impossible

When God sent Jesus (John 3:16) he was the only one not contaminated by the fall of man, Jesus died in our place to free us. When we choose to believe in Him and receive Him as Lord, and then get baptised in the Holy Spirit we become reborn into the Kingdom of Heaven becoming God's sons and daughters. The Holy Spirit is stamped and written within our hearts giving us authority, and enables us to rise up above the limits of the earthly realm, to be able to walk in the presence of God in His higher realm of breaking through the impossible with Him. This allows us to see instant healings, deliverances, working miracles and amazing success in Christ over all the forces of evil.

Many of us are so used to walking in the limited earthly realm, that when we receive Christ we just carry on living in the limited earthly realm. When we realise who we are in Christ, we will realise that all of us can actually rise up to this glorious higher level in Christ. When this happens in us we will then see revival. Let us rise up and live it!

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
